Barbara Catherine Sellers Homesley was born June 7, 1863 and departed this life on Sunday, August 15th, at the age of 80 years, 2 months and eight days.

She was a daughter of the late Easter and Abraham Sellers and was the last of that family of six children.

She was married to John Jacob Homesley in January 1887 who preceded her to the grave thirty years ago. To this union were born nine children, two sons and two daughters having preceded her to the grave, one son, John O'Wick was killed in action in World War I.

Those remaining: Mrs. Frank Loftin, Lincolnton, Mrs. Lizzie Weaver, Arvil and Philbert Homesley of Cherryville, and Hunter Homesley of Mount Holly. Also seven grandchildren and two great grandchildren survive.

Mrs. Homesley joined Shady Grove Baptist church in early life and later moved her membership to the First Baptist church of Cherryville where she remained a member until her death. Due to ill health she had been unable to attend church regularly. But her faith in the Lord was strong and she expressed her readiness to go to the intimate members of her family.

Funeral service was held at Mount Zion Baptist church on Tuesday with the Rev. E. S. Elliott in charge assisted by Rev. W. G. Camp of Mooresville a former pastor officiating.

Interment was made in the Mount Zion cemetery. The floral tributes were beautiful and very much appreciated.

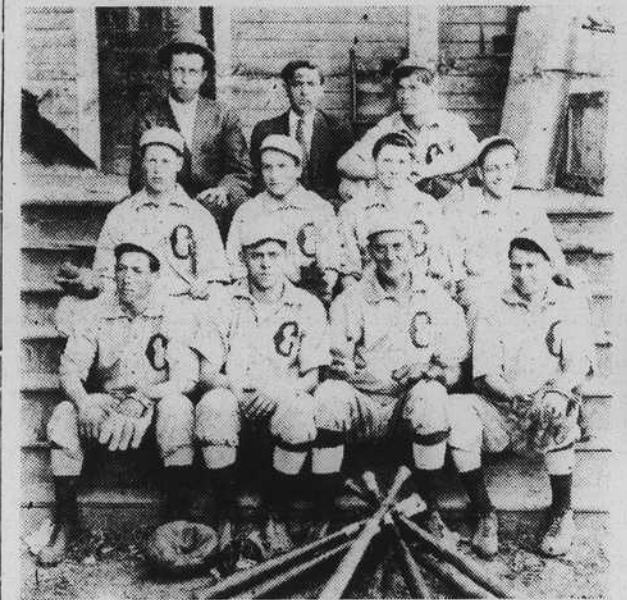

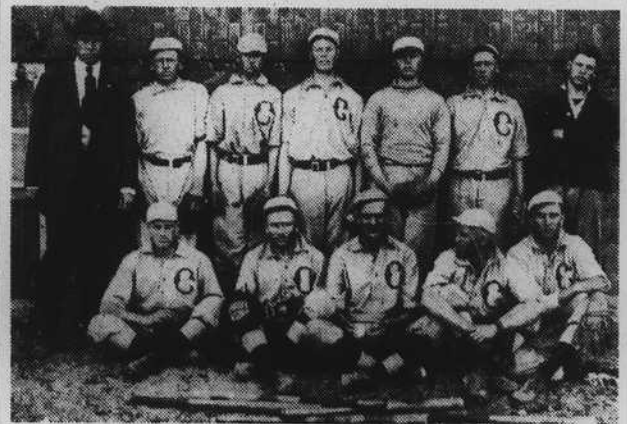
CRACK CHERRYVILLE SCHOOL BASE BALL TEAMS MANY YEARS AGO

A Memorial Service will be held from the First Baptist church Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock for Roy Lee VanDyke, who was killed in action, July 11th, in North Africa. The family was notified by the War Department Saturday afternoon.

Roy Lee is the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. John T. VanDyke and entered the service November 11, 1911. He has been overseas for the past 18 months. So far as is known he is the first Cherryville boy assigned to foreign duties in World War No II and is Cherryville's first casualty.
