TODAY'S CHILDREN ARE TOMORROW'S HOPE

Better Parenthood Week, which is having its sixth annual observance this week seems to belong especially to this column, both because of its sponsorship by the Parents' Magazine and because of the parent-education work it hopes to accomplish. Each year during this special week we have stressed different aspects of making ourselves better parents—the necessity, for instance of first being good men and women, good citizens, good Americans, if we in this country are to be good parents.

This year, confronted as we are by unusual problems in our daily living, we find that the greatest inspiration for Better Parenthood week comes from looking to the future. "Today's Children are Tomorrow's Hope— and Your Responsibility" — that is the 1943 slogan for better Parenthood week, and a plainer, truer call to our best efforts in behalf of children could scarcely be uttered. Let's stop and think what it means.

No matter how soon or how conclusively we win this war, if in waging it we neglect the welfare of the nation's children we will already have endangered the peace. Yes, our enemies will have scored a victory of appalling proportions if in these war years we lower our hard-won standards for safeguarding the health, well-being and educational opportunities for all children. Moreover, we will have failed in our duty to the men who are fighting this war if we allow any of the values for which they are fighting to perish.

These men will bring home with them searing memories of starving, sick destitute children. They will almost have forgotten that such joy as laughing, care-free children could exist anywhere. And they will be determined to wipe out in this country any semblance of conditions such as they have left behind them in battle areas. Never again will they be complacent about seeing that their own children have all the advantages and the children across the tracks have none.

So, in marking the community significance of Better Parenthood Week, let's redouble our efforts during this coming year to adjust any shameful conditions in our own towns and neighborhoods. Are, you, for instance, doing all in your power to stem the wartime increase in juvenile delinquency by providing attractive places where older boys and girls can have a good time? Every community we know of which has helped its young people recreational club has made a success of the venture. If there have been failures we haven't heard of them—and it's usually the place which goes wrong that makes the headlines. Let's grant, then, that community clubs are a practical and sensible way to offset the lure of commercial juke joints, and that they are popular with young people. All that is needed is the energy, the community spirit to put over such a project on behalf of older boys and girls.

Because doctors and nurses are scarce, baby and child-health could be established in many communities. Care for children of mothers who are employed, hot school lunches, employment safeguards for every boy and girl—these are some of the outstanding needs which Better Parenthood week would call to the attention of every public-spirited citizen. We urge you to take an active part in its observance, realizing, as you do so, that the present and the future of this nation depends on the present and future well-being of its homes and its children.
