HOW TO MAIL NEWS-PAPERS, PARCELS, ETC., OVER SEAS

Mail To Them During November For Sure.

The following information in regard to post office regulations will be of interest and beneficial to our readers, and we are glad to pass the information on to the readers.

Copies of publications entered as second-class matter when mailed by the public to army personnel overseas in response to specific requests therefor may be accepted either singly or in quantities at the transit second-class rate of postage of 1 cent for each two ounces or fraction thereof or the parcel-post rate, whichever is lower, provided the parcels are within the limits of weight and size prescribed for overseas mail.

There can be no assurance, in view of the unavoidable handicaps of war, that gifts and cards mailed in the week immediately preceding Christmas will be delivered on time.
