**Ralph McDonald**

**CANDIDATE FOR GOVERNOR**

**RALEIGH, March 20.**—After the war North Carolina will be at the threshold of opportunity for great advancement, agricultural, industrial and social, Ralph W. McDonald, candidate for Governor declared in a statement today.

North Carolina has many advantages of climate, physical resources, geography and people which are unexcelled anywhere," he said. "Effective planning and leadership should bring the opportunities and the resources together to produce great progress."

McDonald declared that new industry of all types will spring in the nation to take advantage

of new inventions during the war and to meet a tremendous post war demand for all kinds of products.

"North Carolina is in ideal position to get more than a usual share of these new enterprises," said McDonald. "We have the power facilities, the agricultural mineral and forest resources, and a high type of manpower to sustain a solid and healthy growth in manufacturing."

Declaring that increased farm income is the greatest economic need of North Carolina, McDonald urged especially effective post-war planning in the field of agriculture. "Here truly is the basis of prosperity in North Carolina," said McDonald. "We must safeguard and strengthen the auction method of tobacco marketing and the marketing facilities for all crops must be improved

in every possible way. Good prices for farm products are essential in any economic progress for North Carolina."

"Through increased emphasis on dairying, beef cattle, poultry, sheep, feed crops, fruit, and all kinds of truck crops, farm income can be raised considerably and farm living at the same time," he declared. "Further progress in agriculture lies ahead through increased mechanization, complete rural electrification, vocational agriculture in all communities, research, and increased financial support of State agricultural services."

Through a major road improvement program and promotion of aviation, McDonald said, North Carolina will be ideally placed to advance all in

dustry through improved transportation facilities.

"While going forward along all lines of material progress we must always place first our human resources," he said. "Through improved health and hospitalization, better schools, more libraries, hospitalization insurance, security against unemployment, and other social advantages, we must plan for happier lives for all our people."

"Above all, our postwar plans must center around a definite strengthening of the moral fibre and the religious faith of our citizenship."
