**RALEIGH, March 20.—After
the war North Carolina will be
at the threshold of opportunity

industrial and social. Ralph
W. McDonald, candidate for Gov-
ernor declared in a statement to**

must plan for happier lives for
all our people."**

and the religious faith of our
citizenship."**
