Only unless you place your declaration and your order for Coal with your dealer is he re-quired to deliver any Coal to you.

If you place your order and with your dealer before May 15, you are entitled to get, be-fore October 1, 30 per cent of your normal requirements if you are ready, willing and able to take delivery of any usable solid fuel on terms agreeable to you and the dealer.

Generally a dealer is prohibited from delivering, and the consumer prohibited from receiving, during the period April 1, 1945, to March 31, 1946, more than 80 per cent of the consumer's normal annual

Generally a dealer is prohibited from receiving, before September 1, 1945, more than 50 per cent of the consumer's normal annual requirements.

Your coal dealer recognizes the probabilities of unforeseen difficulties arising in carrying out these regulations. He, therefore, asks you to learn the facts -- how they apply to you and how they apply to him. Your cooperation is essential.
