MRS. ROOSEVELT LEAVES CAPITAL

WASHINGTON, April 20.—Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt and her family bade goodbye to the White House late today after 12 years' residence.

The former First Lady motored to Union Station, where she took the 6 P. M. train for New York. Accompanying her in two black limousines were Lt. Colonel James Roosevelt and his wife, Brig. Gen. Elliott Roosevelt and his wife, Anna Boettiger, Mrs. John Roosevelt and Miss Melvina Thompson, secretary to the late President's widow.

A station wagon filled with luggage and paper briefcases followed the procession. Mrs. Roosevelt expected to spend the night and Saturday in New York before going to Hyde Park.

Just a few minutes before the group left the White House, Bernard Baruch, a family friend and long an advisor to President Roosevelt drove up in a taxi to bid the family farewell. His stay was brief.

Mrs. Roosevelt and her children shook hands with Howell Crim, head usher and assisting ushers, and waved goodbye to members of the press and White House police. She did not glance at the White

The Senate this tafternoon unanimously passed and sent to the president's widow free mailing privileges for life. This is customary.

CONSUMER DECLARATION

Your coal dealer will supply you with the necessary form for Filing This Declaration. The Declaration requires you to state among other things, the number of rooms to be heated, your normal coal requirements, and the amount of coal you are ordering.

Place Your Declaration And Order NOW

Only unless you place your declaration and your order for Coal with your dealer is he required to deliver any Coal to you.

If you place your order and your consumer declaration with your dealer before May 15, you are entitled to get, before October 1, 30 per cent of your normal requirements if you are ready, willing and able to take delivery of any usable solid fuel on terms agreeable to you and the dealer.

Generally a dealer is prohibited from delivering, and the consumer prohibited from receiving, during the period April 1, 1945, to March 31, 1946, more than 80 per cent of the consumer's normal annual requirements.

Generally a dealer is prohibited from receiving, before September 1, 1945, more than 50 per cent of the consumer's normal annual requirements.

Your coal dealer recognizes the probabilities of unforeseen difficulties arising in carrying out these regulations. He, therefore, asks you to learn the facts — how they apply to you and how they apply to him. Your cooperation is essential.
