U. S. SOLDIERS IN EUROPE FACE Uncertain FUTURE

FRANKFURT, Aug. 13.—The future of more than 2,000,000 American troops in Europe appeared today to hinge on the needs for occupation forces after Japan surrenders.

Maj. Gen. H. R. Bull, acting deputy commander of the U. S. forces in the European theater, said nothing definite had been decided upon regarding the soldiers' future—whether they get home, out of the Army, or even shipped to the Pacific—following Japan's capitulation.

The final decision, he added, would rest with the War department in Washington. There are approximately 2,780,000 American soldiers still in Europe—thousands of them already at staging areas awaiting shipment home, and others slated to go directly to the Pacific.

FIRST 1946 MODEL FORD ATTENDED BY CEREMONY

EDGEWATER, N. J., Aug. 13.—The Ford Motor company staged a ceremony today for the first car to roll from the newly converted assembly line of its plant here, labeling it as the first 1946 model civilian passenger automobile to be built in the East.

The Ford Edgewater plant has been producing trucks, jeeps and other military vehicles and now employs 2,000 workers as compared to a prewar pay roll of 3,000. The Ford plant at Learton, Mich., opened July 3 and turned out 359 cars during July. Capt. Eddie Rickenbacker was selected to drive the first car off the assembly line here.
