### Seed Corn Sent To India By CROP

Mr. George Watson, Manager of Watson Farms, Rocky Mount, N. C., gave 50 pounds each of North Carolina 27 and Dixie 18 Hybrid Seed Corn to go to India for research and experimental purposes. It was announced today by the Rev. Carl R. Key of Durham, State CROP Director, CROP will ship the seed corn by air freight from New York in time to arrive for planting soon after June 7th of this year. When speaking Mr. Watson for this gift, Mr. Key stated that it would "serve as a type of permanent self-help to the people of India."

The seed corn is being sent to a Christian Missionary, The Rev. Donald Rugh, of Delhi, who is Chairman of the Indian National Relief Committee and the Church World Service - CROP representative in India. Mr. Rugh will turn the gift over to the Indian Council of Agricultural Research to carry on the experiments in the wider use of hybrids in India. It is reported by the Iowa State CROP Director, Wilson O. Rugh, who visited with the Rev. Mr. Rugh and Mr. Nehemiah in early April in Delhi that Indians are "very much interested in improving seed corn," poultry and other livestock. Mr. Rugh made a stop to visit with Mr. Rugh and his staff in the course of a round-the-world survey of relief needs and the distribution of such supplies as was completed last year.

Mr. Rugh also stated that North Carolina 27 and Dixie 18 Hybrids have proven to be two of the best varieties used in India for the experimental purposes. Mr. Nehemiah is in charge of the experiments at the Agricultural Research Center. This shipment of seed corn is the second of a number of such relief shipments to be made by North Carolina CROP in 1954. Some fifteen counties have been marked for organization in May and June; to canvass for wheat at harvest time. Twenty-two District Supervisors and Mr. Key, State Director, and Rev. O. L. Runk of Durham, Assistant Director, are already at work on county organization.

### Lincolnton Banks To Send Boys To State College Short Course

The Lincolnton National Bank and the First National Bank, both of Lincolnton, will again this year sponsor two young Lincoln County farmers at a two-week Short Course at N. C. State College. The Short Course will include Livestock, Poultry, Fertilizer, Crop, and General Farming subjects. The Course will last two weeks beginning June 21.

Any boy between 18 and 26 years old, who lives in Lincoln County and plans to farm, is eligible to apply for the Course. All expenses except transportation to and from Raleigh will be paid for by the two local banks. Mr. Everett Henley, Key Banker for Lincoln County for 1954, and George Stoumdire, County Agent will select the two boys to attend. All requests to attend must be given by them by May 25.

The two boys selected will be notified by June 1. The Short Course system of educating farmers in this day of highly developed farm skills is becoming very popular throughout the United States. The courses are specially designed for farmers who do not attend a regular four year college course but who want to keep abreast of the latest things in farming.
