### Social Security Very Important To You

Life expectancy today is about 21 years longer than it was in 1900, according to Mr. Joseph P. Walsh of the Gaston Social Security Office. "This means that the average American now lives 21 years longer."

He pointed out that most of us from time to time, have sat down quietly and taken stock of what we are doing and where we were going. Figuring up our assets and abilities, we decided what to do for a living, whom to marry, where to live, how to bring

up our children, etc. In many cases this planning is not too definite; often we more or less drift into things. ### Pvt. James W. Holt At Fort Jackson

Fort Jackson, S. C. — Private James W. Holt, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. P. Holt, 401 N. Elm Street, Cherryville, N. C., has been assigned to Company G of the 500th Airborne Infantry Regiment for basic training.

He will spend the next eight weeks here learning the fundamentals of being a soldier. This includes classroom lectures in such subjects as military courtesy, first aid and character guidance, and combat field problems involving the use of the M-1 rifle, which he will learn to fire on various ranges.

After eight weeks of training with the 102nd Airborne Infantry Division, the trainee is given about 14 days leave. He may return here for eight more weeks of infantry training, or he may be assigned to one of the many Army schools.

Basic training is required of each new man coming into the Army. Fort Jackson is one of the Army's largest training stations. Primarily an infantry training post, the Fort offers schooling in specialties associated with infantry divisions, as well as combat tactics.

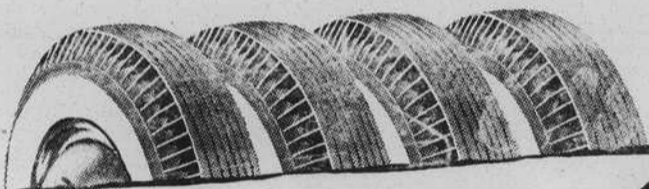
