Raleigh — "Skidding and poor vision are a gruesome twosome," Motor Vehicles Commissioner Edward Scheidt said this week in listing two conditions as being primarily responsible for the increased hazards of winter driving. "Inadequate traction and reduced visibility," he said, "when combined with the normal hazards of every-day driving, can easily trap the unwary driver and lead directly to an accident."

Statistical studies made by the Motor Vehicles Depatment have indicated that there are two major factors in winter time traffic accidents, Scheidt said.

"Reduced visibility," he explained, "is brought about by longer hours of darkness, bad weather conditions caused by heavy rain or snow, and obstructions to the driver's vision from frost, ice, and muddy windshields."

"Special studies," he said, "have shown the driver's vision was on structed by rain, snow or ice on the windshield in 143 of the state's 977 fatal accidents last

chief causes of inadequate traction."

Scheidt pointed out that according to the studies, the weather was rainy, foggy or snowy in 123 of the fatal mishaps, while wet and muddy roads were reported in 120.

"The answer," he said, "is to slow down and drive with the utmost caution when rain, snow and ice coat the highway."

The vehicles commissioner urged every Tar Heel driver to take extra precautions during December and particularly not to be caught unawares by the "gruesome twosome" of skidding and poor vision.

Scheidt asked in a recent letter to approximately 850 automobile dealers that they designate December 14 and 15 as "special safety-check days."

"S-D Day" - Safe Driving Daywill focus the nation's attention on good driving practices. On December 15 it is hoped the nation's 70 million licensed drivers will go without a single traffic accident.

According to figure from the Carolina Safety League brakes, steering and lights, in that order, were featues most often found defective.

Approximately 250,000 vehicles have been checked since the voluntary inspection project was launched last April.
