So, bring your family to town on Tuesday afternoon and do your Christmas shopping and also get you a supply of groceries for the week.



## TB Cases Public Health Problem

RALEIGH, Nov. 23—The unknown cases of tuberculosis, even more than the known cases, reveal the seriousness of TB as a public health problem in North Carolina. This view was expressed here today by Dr. William A. Smith, Chief of the Tuberculosis Control Section of the State Board of Health.

Health.

"People who have tuberculosis without knowing it present the most serious threat," according to Dr. Smith. "It is estimated that in the United States there are 150,000 active unknown cases, and we can logically assume that North Carolina has its proportionate share."
