### TO RESUME SALK SHOTS JANUAKY 31

GASTONIA — Tentative plans by the health department call for operation Sure Shot to resume January 31. when around 700 children will be given the third shot of Salk anti-polio vaccine.

The operation was suspended temporarily last November when the health department completed giving two shots to around 9,000 children of the first four grades of school.

This will leave around 8,500 children eligible for third doses in the spring. The health department is still working on plans for the spring program and an announcement is expected soon as to whether or not this part of the program can be carried out.

The patches should be located near good cover, and will require one bag of 6-8-6 or 4-6-4 fertilizer. Applications for the free bags of seed mixture can be obtained from the district wildlife biologists, county agents, Soil Conservation Service agents, and from the county wildlife protectors. Planting instructions come with the bags of seed.

March 1 is the deadline for applications for shrub lespedeza, he said.
