Sunbury.—Mrs. T. L. Pierce entertained the members of Sunbury Book Club at her home on Wednesday afternoon.

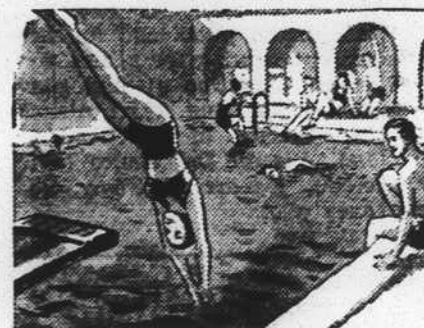
