Employers Neglect To Prepare Forms

A number of employers in the Northeastern area have failed to prepare Form WMC-NC-106 and mail them to the U.S. Employment Service Offices, stated P. B. Pollock, area director of the War Manpower Commission. These forms indicate employment as of March 1, April 1, and May 1, 1944, and the hires and separations during April, 1944.

The responsibility of forwarding this information to the Em-



ployment Service Offices de. finitely belongs to the employer, and failure to do so will prevent the establishment of a ceiling for his business, thus restricting him from hiring any additional workers, Mr. Pollock said. The area director urged employers to mail these forms so that their ceilings may be recommended to the Manpower Priorities Commitee which meets in the area office in Washington next week.
