FOR MEN IN THE ARMY

MEN now in Army who reenlist before February 1 will be reenlisted in present grade. Men honorably discharged can reenlist within 20 days after discharge charge, provided they reenlist before February 1, 1946.

You may enlist AT ANY TIME for 11/2, 2 or 3 year periods. (One-year enlistments for men new in the Army with at least 6 months of service.)


