Church Members Plant Shrubbery At Cool Springs

Eure.—A twelve-member volunteer beautification committee from Cool Springs Baptist church last Saturday set out 37 pieces of shrubbery around the church grounds, as a part of a landscaping plan initiated by the Cool Springs members of the Eure Home Demonstration club.

The committee was aided in its work of setting out the plants by Miss Ona Patterson, county home demonstration agent, and John W. Artz, county agent.

Included in the plants now in place in the beautification are wax-leaf privet, abelias, spirea, weigelia, hydrangeas, jessamine and euonymus.
