CHILDREN LOST

FIVE OF THEM BURNED IN AN ORPHANAGE.

Terrible Catastrophe At The Shelton Memorial Cottage Near Lynchburg.

Late Tuesday afternoon the remains of the five children who were burned in the fire which destroyed the Shelton cottages at the Presbyterian orphan's home, near Lynchburg were recovered, though they were burned past recogni-

A coroner's inquest threw no light on the cause of the fire, but the verdict included a statement fully exonorating the home authorities from blame.

Reports show that the fire was discovered by the housekeeper in her room on the second floor by smoke issuing through the speaking tube connecting her room with the kitchin. The children were all in the second floor of the of the building and they were caught by the fire in a manner that made their rescue impossible. One was taken out of the building, but when she ascertained that the younger sister was still inside she ran back into the burning building and lost her life.

The fire was discovered by the cook, who was aroused by the roar of the flames. When she saw that it was impossible to get the childreno out by the stairway, the entire basement and first floor at that time being enveloped, and that it would be but a few minutes before the whole building would fall, she rushed to the third story and brought fifteen children down to the second floor, leading them to the veranda top, where they were taken down a ladder, several of them dropping into outstretched arms of the older boys in the institution.

When the children were all safe, the cook had to jump for her life and in so doing sustained a dislocated shoulder, a scalp wound, and an injury to her back. She will probably recover. While all of the escapes were miraculous, only one of the girls rescued was injured and she escaped with a sprainel ankle, sustained by jumping.
