EXHIBIT TOWN'S FINANCES.

Annual Statement Now Being Circulated--The Treasurer's Report.

Mr. Robert Halston, ex-treasurer of the city has issued his exhibit showing the collections and disbursements of the city's finances during the twelve months from June, 1908, to June, 1909. There has been a delay in getting the exhibit printed. The city tax collector, Capt. J. W. Peay, returned tax tickets to the amount of \$183.13 for parties who had removed; improperly listed and outside of the corporation \$43.80, and for parties who died since taxes were listed, \$6.20. The insolvents amounted to only \$11.95.

VETERAN EDITOR PASSES TO HIS REWARD.

Succumbs to Effects of Second Paralytic Stroke--Funeral This Afternoon.

Hon. John R. Webster died at his residence on Main street Sunday morning at 5:30 o'clock. Friday and Saturday his condition appeared to be very much improved, but early in the afternoon Saturday he began to sink and by 6 o'clock it was given out by physicians that he could not live many hours longer. His illness came as a result of a stroke of paralysis, affecting his left side, which he suffered a week previous. Four years ago his right side was paralyzed and he has been very feeble since. The recent stroke caused him to feel a slight improvement in the condition of his right side and his friends had hoped that he would recover sufficiently to get up again.
