GLASS EYE FOR CHRISTMAS

Judge Heeds Children's Plea For Present For Their Father.

Two children, one a boy, seven years old, and the other a girl, nine, entered the Hamilton county court recently, says a report from Cincinnati, and asked to see Probate Judge Tueters.

When brought before him the older child told the judge that their mother was dead and that they had inherited some property from her. They asked if they might be allowed to have a part of the income from this source to purchase a Christmas present for their father.

When Judge Tueters asked the nature of the proposed gift the girl explained that her father, who had been injured and had lost thereby the sight of one eye, needed a glass eye to replace the missing optic. The judge granted their request.
