

HOW CAPITAL SIZED UP ARTHUR JAMES BALEFOUR

Washington has sized up Arthus James Balfour in this way: Five feet ten and three-quarter inches in height.

Weight 155 pounds or thereabout. Of slender figure, with narrow shoulsinewy arms-a figure unusually athletic for a man of sixty-nine years.

The Balfour face is "sharp," though the mild gray blue eyes detract somewhat from the general impression gained when the Balfour countenance is in repose. The nose is aquiline, almost hawklike, with prominent bridge.

The Balfour eyes are rather prominent, ordinarily steely and penetrating save when the Balfour smile comes into them to radiate over the entire face. This smile is infectious-"winning," it might almost be called.

The chief use Mr. Balfour makes of his brilliant power of speech is to keep it out of action most of the time. He is an eloquent listener, his smile taking the place of speech.
