

MINUTES COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, NOVEMBER 5, 1917

Board met pursuant to adjournment with the following members present: R. E. Wall, chairman; J. S. Wells, W. A. Webster, L. W. Matthews and W. A. Johnson.

On motion it was ordered that all bills against the County be presented on or before the 20th day of the month, and all bills received after that time will be held until the following month for payment.

On motion it was ordered that H. E. McCollum be allowed to list poll and property tax in Wentworth Township.

On motion W. B. Miller was allowed to file a petition for the laying out of Cartway over lands of Cicero Knight which was laid on the table for action at the next meeting of the board on the 3rd Monday in November.

On motion it was ordered that James Carter, Keeper of the County Home be paid a salary of \$50.00 per month.

On motion it was ordered that the board recommend Harry Bowman of Reidsville as an eligible patient for treatment and training at Caswell training school and request that he be admitted to that institution.

On motion C. W. Scott and Mrs. M. E. Elmore were relieved of the penalty of 3 per cent. on taxes for 1916, it appearing that it was not the negligence on their part that their taxes were not paid in due time.

On motion it was ordered that the Jailor be paid 50 cents per day for feeding prisoners to the number not exceeding 10 and all over 10 shall receive 15 cents each per day.

On motion it was ordered that the road from Cobtown by way of Anderson place to Reidsville be topsoiled as soon as a force can be secured to do the work, the proper petitions giving right of way and top soil having been filed with the board.

On motion of Johnson, seconded by Wells that the County buy an adding machine for \$225.00 less 2 per cent. for cash.

On motion the proposition of J. N. Ambler to perform the engineering work, be accepted, on the road between Leaksville and Spray as per contract filed after having been signed by the Chairman and authorized by the Board.

The Board having heretofore agreed by proper motion duly made and carried to pay for one half the cost of certain repairing and reconstruction of Macadam road in Leaksville Township from bridge across Smith River near Spray Motor Company, to the corporate line of the town of Leaksville and after due advertisement for bids for said work and due consideration of all bids made the R. M. Hudson Paving Co. in the opinion of the Board is the best bid made.

Therefore, be it resolved that the bid of the R. M. Hudson Paving Co. filed with this board for reconstructing said road and paving same with sheet asphalt be, and the same is hereby accepted.

Resolved further that the Chairman of this board be and is hereby authorized, empowered and instructed to sign and execute a contract covering this work when said contract is approved by the Attorney of this board and engineer selected by this Board.

By order of the Board the following be allowed to list taxes: C. Vestal, Car \$250, pistol \$3, watch \$5, gun \$4; Frank Howerton cash in Bank \$100; A. M. Johns, all the above from Leaksville Township.

Board adjourned to meet November 19th, 1917.

On motion the petition of W. M. Collins for Cartway across the lands of W. T. Ledbetter was taken by the Superior Court and was appeal by W. M. Collins and it was ordered that all papers in the matter be transferred to the Superior Court for trial.

On motion Dr. Johnson, seconded by Matthews, it was ordered that Wash Watt be remitted \$12.50 rebate on license for running a pool room.

On motion of Commissioner Webster and seconded by Dr. Johnson it was ordered that bridge be built across Belews creek at Payne Mill.

On motion of Dr. Johnson, seconded by Matthews, it was ordered that a road force be sent to Ruffin township at an early date provided that proper petitions are filed giving right of way and top soil to be used in building said road.

Board adjourned to meet Monday December 3rd, 1917.
