NOTICE OF ELECTION

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Durham:

1. That an election be held in the City of Durham on Tuesday, March 16, 1915 for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the voters relative to adopting a new Charter for the City of Durham, as provided for in an act passed by the General Assembly, session of 1915.

2. That all ballots shall be printed on white paper and shall be of the same size, without device, mutilation or ornamentation. That the size of said ballots shall be one and one-half (1 1/2) inches by three (3) inches. That there shall be printed or written on said ballots "For New Charter," which ballot shall be cast by those favoring the adoption of the new charter for said city, and those opposed to adopting the new charter shall cast a ballot of same size, printed or written thereon "Against New Charter."

That the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to furnish a sufficient number of said ballots and have same at the various voting precincts on said day of election, for the use of the voters of the City of Durham.

3. That the following named persons are hereby designated and appointed Registrars and Judges of election to conduct said election at the voting precincts in said city:

Precinct No. 1, Five Points. Registrar R. C. Cox; Judges of election L. W. Grissom, J. H. Allen.
 Precinct No. 2, Eakes Store Mangum Street. Registrar J. T. Green; Judges of election L. B. Markham, J. W. Carlton.

Precinct No. 3, Howerton's Store (formerly Parrish warehouse.) Registrar R. T. Howerton; Judges of election W. J. Monk, J. W. Chandler.

Precinct No. 4, Perry's Store, (formerly Ferrell's.) Registrar W. S. Holloway; Judges of election C. W. Stallings, L. S. Sasser.

Precinct No. 5, Brady's Store. Registrar W. E. Hall; Judges of election John B. Walker, Jr., Ben Perry.

Precinct No. 6, Court House. Registrar W. B. Bagwell; Judges of election W. H. Proctor, W. S. Newton.

Precinct No. 7, Hunt's Store, Jackson Street. Registrar J. Y. Reid; Judges of election J. G. Elliott, Alphonus Cobb.

Precinct No. 8, Sykes Store, Milton Avenue. Registrar J. A. Hood; Judges of election W. L. Johnson, W. T. Green.

That the above named persons be notified as provided by law. Registration books will open for the registration of voters, beginning February 26, 1915. Each registrar shall, between the hours of nine o'clock a. m. and five o'clock p. m. on each day (Sunday excepted) up to and including March 6, 1915, keep open said registration books for the registration of any new electors residing in the precinct.

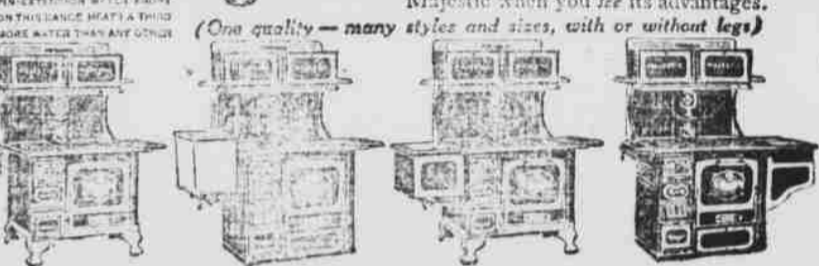
