### THE GREAT BATTLE.

The great battle that has been expected for some time is now in Dobson township was held here northern France.

The Germans after a wait of a month began their offensive drive on Monday of last week with the hope and expectation of driving back the French and their allies and capturing Paris and the channel ports. All during the week the battle raged at different sectors along the entire front. The allied troops held their ground and drove the Germans back succeeding in penetrating their lines at a number of points and capturing several towns that had been occupied by them to gether with several thousand prisoners and large quantities of heavy guns and munitions.

At this time heavy fighting is still going on and the British, French and American troops are driving the Germans back at every point and it looks now Je If there would be a complete rout of the enemy. It is the general belief that this battle will be the turning point in the war and that peace will soon dawn once more over the land. Let us hope and trust that this may be the result.
