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John M. Parker won the nomination for governor of Louisiana strictly upon personal qualifications, and in the face of the strongest opposition by the machine, which he succeeded in smashing to smithereens.

Mr. Parker has a reputation for strong personality. He is forceful and untrifled. He is not afraid to expose the wrongdoing of the bosses and the corruption, which he fought openly and honestly for the benefit of public morals, and with the result that the fair-minded people of his state gave him their support, in the interest of good government and economy.

Mr. Parker will be the next governor of Louisiana, and the controllers of the political machinery, who sought his destruction, may now sit down amid the wreckage and contemplate the result of their fast and loose methods in the administration of government; methods that had become notorious, extravagant and distasteful to the people, who wanted good government.

Rhode Island, with a rum appetite and a "dark-brown" taste in the mouths of her people, seeks action to have the National Prohibition Amendment declared unconstitutional. In opposition are twenty-six states, whose governors and leading statesmen stand up for good government and the suppression of the liquor traffic. A number of other states will soon take their places beside the twenty-six to contest Rhode Island's action. Judge Charles E. Hughes, of New York, general counsel for the opposing states, will ask to interfere in the action now pending in the Supreme Court.

Rhode Island has not the "ghost of a show" of winning her case, and the quicker the people realize that "John Barleycorn" has been dethroned and declared an outlaw, the better it will be for the happiness of all, and the longer his exile the fewer will be the people who will have the temerity to acknowledge fealty to that vice-regent of Satan.

**Russian Exodus Threatened**  
 The announcement of the Worker's Defense Union, that "As a protest against the government's conduct of the alien deportation cases" a movement will be started to bring about a general exodus from the United States of all Russians, will, if carried out, be a happy solution of a knotty problem.

The Russians back of the movement disclaim it is said, all connection with the communist or soviet organization, and claim that they are acting solely because of "injustice inflicted upon foreigners."

This statement is not borne out in fact when they add: "The Soviet government has offered to provide 100 ships for the general withdrawal, as soon as relations with the outside world become more settled."

The movement is carried out according to the threatened plan, will relieve this government of great anxiety. Russia is the place for all of that stripe of so-called citizens. They are not Americans, and the quicker they are landed upon their native shores the better for us and for them; and, if they carry out their threat, this government will be relieved of much trouble and expense. After they have departed we should close our door behind them and meet a conspicuous sign, that can be read across the Atlantic: "America for Americans Only."

If the alien desiring admission into this country cannot furnish a clean bill of health and evidence of reasonably good character, and also express a willingness or desire to become an American citizen, he should not be permitted to land in America. America does not need the scum of Europe. We want the best or none at all.

**Measles—A Dangerous Disease.**

Measles is responsible for about 200,000 cases of sickness and 10,000 deaths in the United States every year.

Measles is the most contagious disease of childhood. Ninety-nine per cent of those who have never had the disease will contract it on being exposed to the infection, and practically every body has had or will have measles sooner or later, then if we all are to have this disease, let us remember that there is a right time and a wrong time to have measles. A time when the disease is without great danger, and a time when the disease is of one of the most dangerous. After five years of age measles rarely kills, claiming only about two victims in every one hundred cases. Under or between three and five years of age measles take one out of eight of its victims, under two years of age measles takes one out of every four of its victims. Take care of the baby. The death rate from measles among babies under two years or even three years of age, is too great for parents to take any risks, when measles exists in the community.

Don't forget the complications of measles. About ten per cent of all cases have broncho-pneumonia and practically all deaths from measles are associated with a certain amount of broncho-pneumonia. Another very important complication of the disease is its tendency to involve the ears. About one tenth of all deafness is due to measles. "Remember, children do not at ways become deaf in childhood but, twenty, thirty or more years later, when they, perhaps are parents, or when positions in life are open to them, they are denied advancement and better salaries, because they are deaf. Many of the delights of music, and conversation are denied them because of deafness from measles."

Do you know of a parent who does not love their children? Protect your child. Keep it from having measles. You can. DR. L. L. WILLIAMS, County Health Officer
