We are not taking much stock in the political fight that is being waged at present by the special friends of the three candidates who are seeking the nomination for Governor of North Carolina. Occasionally we print a letter or communication from the friends of some one of the three candidates, but it is done as an advertisement and is paid for just like our other advertisers pay for theirs. Gardner partisans are stuffing the papers full of glowing accounts, greatest audiences, most overwhelming speech and wildest enthusiasm, while Morrison press agents and reporters tell wonderful stories about their candidate and the great throngs that flock to hear the burning words that pierce to the very bone.

Page people are less demonstrative and record breaking, yet they would have the people believe that their man is a certain winner. One day last week a report was published that Gardner had made a speech in a certain place and that he had the county by the horns, lock stock and barrel; next day a Morrison dispatch was heralded to the world from the same community making the very same claims. Such stuff is not news and the people are tired of it. We believe every voter has his mind made up now as to which one of the three men he wants to direct the affairs of the State for the next four years. We hope every voter in North Carolina will go to the polls on the 5th of June and vote his honest sentiments and settle this matter. We don't want a second primary.

Typhoid Fever.

The three sources for the spread of typhoid fever are water, flies and contact with a person sick with the disease.

"Contact" is a convenient term to indicate the spread of the infection directly or indirectly as a result of close association between the sick and the sound. Typhoid fever infection then may be passed from one to another through kissing, soiled hands, remnants of food, infected thermometers, or tongue depressors, contaminated towels or other fabrics, cups, spoons, glasses etc. The infection may also be spread in the home hold by flies, fingers and various other means, usually difficult to trace, and which are, therefore, all included under this group. Regarded in this light, contacts play a large role in the spread of disease.

Studies of the incidence of typhoid fever in our largest hospitals, show that typhoid fever is at least twice as prevalent among those who come in close and frequent association with the person sick with the disease, as among the population at large. Further, the disease contracted under such conditions seems to be a course of more than ordinary severity, with a greater number of complications and with a high mortality.

Typhoid fever, in view of all the facts, must now be regarded as a "contagious" disease. We will never have an end of it until it is so regarded and treated accordingly.
