Robah Baity Convicted First Degree Murder--To Pay Death Penalty July 2

The celebrated murder case in Yadkin county which has been on trial since last Thursday in which Robah Baity and Spencer McNeil were being tried for the murder of Sheriff Zachary has been finished and while the result was a surprise to a great many people yet it could hardly have been otherwise. The jury was secured Thursday, being composed of twelve men from Surry county. The prisoners were arraigned at the bar and trial commenced. All day Friday and Saturday was taken in examining witnesses and hearing the pleadings of the attorneys for the prosecution and defense. Monday morning at 9 o'clock the Sheriff called court and business was resumed. Judge Harding charged the jury in an able manner, reviewing all the evidence and giving them all necessary legal advice in the matter, ordered them to take the case and render their verdict. The jury after being out for some time came in to the court room and returned a verdict of guilty of murder in first degree against Baity, and not guilty as to McNeil. Tuesday at 2 o'clock, P. M., Judge Harding sentenced Baity to be electrocuted on the 2nd day of July, 1931. Baity's counsel immediately gave notice of appeal but we have not heard whether the appeal was granted.

In the primary election that will be held on Saturday, June 5th you are expected to vote for your choice for a candidate for U. S. Senator, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, State Auditor, State Treasurer, Commissioner of Agriculture, Labor and Printing, Insurance and two associate Justices of the Supreme Court. In the spirited contest now being waged throughout the State by the three rival candidates for Governor there is danger of losing sight of the minor offices that are to be filled. In the office of State Auditor there are five candidates seeking the nomination. The list is headed by Mr. James P. Cook, of Cabarrus county, who is well known throughout the State and is in every way well equipped to fill the office to which he aspires. He has the endorsement of many of the most prominent men of the State, among whom are Hon. R. A. Doughton, of Sparta, who says: "I shall take great pleasure in supporting you for State Auditor at the June primary. Best wishes," and Prof. C. C. Wright, of Wilkes, who says: "I am gratified that Mr. Cook is a candidate for State Auditor. I desire to say frankly that there is no man in the State whom I prefer to see hold this important position, and I shall be pleased to do all I can for him." I have known Mr. Cook for the past thirty years and know that the democratic voters of North Carolina will make no mistake in making him State Auditor. I earnestly appeal to the voters of Surry, Yadkin, Wilkes and Allegheny to rally to the support of James P. Cook for Auditor on June 5th.

It is a remarkable fact that the term politics sometimes implies mud slinging methods, trickery and deceit. It is likewise an inspiring fact that it sometimes implies an orderly campaign between christian gentlemen for an office of honor. Prof. N. Y. Gulley, dean of the Wake Forest Law School, is a candidate for the office of justice of the North Carolina Supreme Court. The thousands of students who have studied under Prof. Gulley are standing back of his candidacy to a man. Those who know him best love and respect him most. Prof. Gulley has never sought political preferment and it should be a source of pleasure to all North Carolina voters to put in office a man whose sterling qualities will uphold every tradition of the highest court of justice in the Old North State.

Do away with the breeding places for the fly-maggot-pain, garbage, or any organic decaying matter. Whenever there is the accumulation of filth you are going to have the housefly. By doing away with the decaying organic matter you will lessen the danger of disease. Screen your windows and doors and seal the stray flies that get into the house through opening and closing of the doors.


