BIG MONEY THEFT IN GERMANY CLEARED UP

Four Soldiers Are Arrested For Stealing Great Volume Of Rumanian Paper

TOOK PLACE A YEAR AGO
Berlin, June 30.—The Associated Press reports that the mystery surrounding the theft of 10,000,000 Rumanian lei (thirty times as much as the German mark) has now been cleared up by the arrest of four soldiers, who were assigned to the task of guarding paper money and treasure which was stored in the Rhine valley.

The men, who were drafted for service and subsequently sentenced to prison, were found guilty of the theft. They were recently discovered by German customs officers at the frontier of the Rhine valley. The men were arrested in the city of Cologne, where they were found with the stolen money. The money was transported back from the Rhine valley.
