Emissary Is An American Citizen Who Has Been Appointed to Direct the Work of Cleaning up After War.

Raleigh. From the ranks of the world health officers are beginning to turn to North Carolina to study the work and to profit by the experience of North Carolina's Department of Health, was the technical adviser of the Minister of Health for this new European republic of Czechoslovakia here to find out from Dr. Rankin and his staff how they go about doing things.

The technical adviser was Dr. R. M. Quay, formerly professor of Public Health at Harvard University, now director head of the tuberculosis work in the American expeditionary forces in Europe for three years, and now appointed by the Czechoslovakian government to direct the work of cleaning up that country and making healthy after six years of war.

The Doctor was surprised when someone asked why he came to North Carolina. "Don't you know that North Carolina has the best public health service in the world?" he asked in reply to his questioner. He thought that by all means it was. Dr. Quay ought to know all about it, and expect as a natural result that other health men would come here to find out about things.

Dr. Quay spent the entire day with Dr. Rankin and his staff, and declared that he learned a lot that will serve a splendid purpose when he gets back to Europe.

Must Not Jump Contracts. State Superintendent of Public Instruction E. C. Braxton has notified all city and county superintendents that the state board will not recognize teachers who sign up with one school system, and then break their contracts.

There is no law against breaking these contracts, but the ruling of the board is that no salary fund for that particular teacher will be provided from the general educational funds of the state.

Should a teacher begin work for one city or one county, and break that contract to go to another city or county, the school committee to which she goes will have to provide the pay for the full term, for the state will not provide money for teachers breaking their contracts.

Census Reports (Continued).

Washington. The census bureau announced the population of Wilson and Edgecombe counties as follows: Wilson county, 36,811; increase, 5,444 or 16.2 per cent; incorporated places—Black Creek, 274; Elko City, 155; Elkmont, 518; Stauntonburg, 424; Wilson, 1,812.

Edgecombe county, 47,800; increase, 5,000 or 11.1 per cent; incorporated places—Bettieville, 304; Caudle, 300; Macedonia, 294; Pinetops, 162; Princeton, 383; Rocky Mount, 1,742; Shippensburg, 334; Tarboro, 1,128; Winterville, 725.

Rocky Mount has a population of 12,742 and Wilson 18,812; the census bureau announced. Edgecombe county, of which Rocky Mount is the largest city, has a total population of 27,882, as compared with 22,800 in 1910. Wilson county has a total of 56,813 as compared with 43,969 in 1910 and 42,800 in 1900.

Elkhorn Has Statute Here.

George Langdon, the new French minister and foreign minister in Paul Miller's cabinet, is the father-in-law of Paul Rockwell, a North Carolina, who served in the Foreign Legion during the World War. Young Rockwell's mother is Mrs. Lydia Rockwell, of Winston-Salem, and by a cousin of Mrs. William H. Rosemond, of Hillsboro.

Campaign of Education.

If an election day there are those still uninterested about the revenue act, its purpose and its workings, it will not be the fault of the administration, for every possible effort is being made to get this information to the public.

The special session authorized the governor to have printed and distributed 50,000 copies of his revenue bill, a copy to the special session. The bill of the tax commission was also ordered distributed throughout the state.

Census Report (Continued).

Washington—Revised census figures for Greenbrier, given out by the Census Bureau, show a population for the date of 19,581. The previous announcement figures were 19,746. The bureau gave the census of Gafford county as 19,882, an increase during the past decade of 18,710 or 31 per cent.

Incorporated places in the county, with their populations, are: Gibsonville, 1,388; Greenbrier (incorporated), 19,581; High Point, 14,303; Stokesdale, 178.

The census of McDowell county was announced as 11,715, a decrease of 5,297, a decrease of 34.8 per cent. The population of Spruce Pine, in this county is 111.

The population of Orange county was given as 18,932, an increase of 8,128 or 33.8 per cent. Incorporated places are: Black Mountain, 2,811; Marion, 81; Spring Hill, 700; Waldron, 1,185; Glendale, N. C., 1,385.

Spring Hope, N. C., 1,231.

Transylvania county, 32,720, an increase during the past 10 years of 148, or 2.8 per cent.

Populations of incorporated places announced were: Concord, 9,882; Mount Pleasant, 779.

Transylvania county, 41,061, an increase of 7,334 during the past ten years, or 1.7 per cent.

Populations of incorporated places in the county follow:

Bank and Savings Deposits.

Deposits in North Carolina banks increased more than \$50,000,000 in the last fiscal year, being now considerably 16 weeks, or \$100,000,000. The growth of savings deposits, in the same period was more than \$21,000,000, and these are today between 18,000 and 18,500 more individual savings accounts in the banks of the Old North States than ever before. These figures are from a report just filed by the War Loan Organization of the Fifth Federal Reserve District from information furnished by the banks, by the state bank examiner and by the controller of the currency in Washington.

Relations With Japan Becoming Badly Strained Though There Is No Danger of War.

TOKYO LEARNS U. S. STAND

Disclosures of Czechbadness in Organized Baseball Arouse Indignation and Grief—Police and Baron Wrangel Still Driving the Reds—Moscow Eager for Peace.

Despite the undoubted fact that the governments of the United States and Japan are earnestly striving to arrive at some kind of settlement of their differences, the relations between the two nations are becoming more strained daily. This does not mean that either will engage such an eventuality as almost out of the question—but the situation is giving undesirable opportunity to the garrulous and the bigoted of both countries and is really worrying the statesmen and those directly interested in international commerce.

The administration of Washington has sent to Tokyo a communication stating just how far it is willing to go to meet the desires of the Japanese, and this proposition was taken under consideration by the Japanese cabinet. At neither cabinet nor any other level of the government of the Americans are, however, it was reported in Washington that any of the fundamental considerations insisted upon by the administration in that country shall give a iota guarantee against immigration to the United States or to the "gentlemen's agreement" under which since 1907 Japan has undertaken to prevent the emigration of laborers to America.

If Japan agreed to accept any such arrangement, it probably would be in the "gentlemen's agreement" for the Japanese people would naturally insist on a formal treaty to which they, at most, would not be party and in which the Japanese would be compelled to admit the Americans into their country.
