Now that the rush of the planting season is over and farm labor is more leisure, if there is not enough land planted to corn to feed all livestock on the farm and there is likely to be insufficient amount of rough feed on the farm. Why not plant a ate patch of corn, for late roast-ng ears and feed. Corn planted now will likely mature before frost and should it not mature it makes excellent feed cut the roasting ear stage and fed to

In planting this late corn pat h a piece of fertile land should be selected if possible, then all the barnyard manure available should be applied, and a liberal amount of fertilizer used. It tivation to make this late corn The corn can be planted after wheat or oats are harvested. You may say that this is hard on land, to be sure it is hard on land if there is not an application of manure applied, which should be done. But it is hard on the pocket book to buy corn. 
