> QUESTION: What minerals, in addition to salt, should be fed dairy animals?

> ANSWER: Calcium and phosphorus are the two main requirements. Under ordinary circumhowever, these minerals are found in sufficient quantity in the balanced ration. During early part of the lactation period a good producing cow will draw on the mineral reserve stored in the bones, and it is therefore advisable to add two pounds of a mineral mixture composed of finely ground limestone and steamed bone meal to each 100 pounds of the concentrate ration. This will help restore the minerals taken from the bone.
