SECOND INSTALLMENT

Final Half of 1936 Saw No Sensational News Occurring Locally

NEW SCHOOL IS BEGUN

Outstanding local news of the last six months of 1936, taken in brief from Tribune headlines, follows below, the news summary of the first six months of the past year having been published last week:

JULY 2 ISSUE

Christmas Seal sale to start.
Caleb Wagoner, Surry outlaw, is captured without shot being fired.

DECEMBER 10 ISSUE
Commissioners here pass laws to remedy parking and traffic situation.
King Edward, of England, abdicates throne for love of Mrs.

Wallis Simpson, American born woman.

Surry county officers are sworn in.

DECEMBER 17 ISSUE
Visitors here need not heed one-hour parking law.
Surry county commissioners buy Mountain Park property.
Thirteen Surry veterans receive pension checks.

DECEMBER 24 ISSUE
