It was strange indeed to see the steering wheel of the empty car, upon approaching a corner, turn without human hands upon it and safely steer the machine in the way it should go. Thousands of people were in North Wilkes-

boro to see the parade, and everyone of this entire section is urged to be in Elkin Saturday to see this amazing and mysterious exhibition.

The parade here, in addition to the driverless car, is expected to be participated in by the local Boy Scouts, the fire department, the state highway patrol and anyone who desires to enter. Floats stressing safety will be welcomed from all local firms which desire to enter them.

The car to be used as the "Magic Car" will be a 1937 Ford V-8. This car will be operated from a 1937 Chevrolet, which will be driven by Captain Lynch while at the same time he operates the car ahead. A 1937 Dodge car will be used as the official car in which Mayor J. R. Poindexter and other town officials will ride.
