Tobacco Specialists Of Opinion Flea Bug Damaging Leaf Crop

(Continued from front page) bought at any drug store or feed and seed store.

The experts making the study were E. G. Moss, director of the state tobacco experiment station, Oxford; W. A. Shands, director tobaccco insect study at the station, and Dr. R. F. Poole, plant pathologist, State College. They came into this section of the state Saturday morning and covered most of the better tobacco growing counties yesterday and today.

The seriousness of the disaster is indicated in the urgency with which Congressman Hancock and Doughton appealed to the special. ists to make their study and the quick response they received. None of the three experts pressed an opinion on how far the crop of tobacco would be cut. However, Mr. Brumfield stated that conceivably the crop could be cut as much as half and that the remainder of the crop naturally would not be up to normal inasmuch as it would be brough to maturity under such abnormal conditions.
