We are glad indeed to have with us again some of our members who have been forced to remain away by sickness.

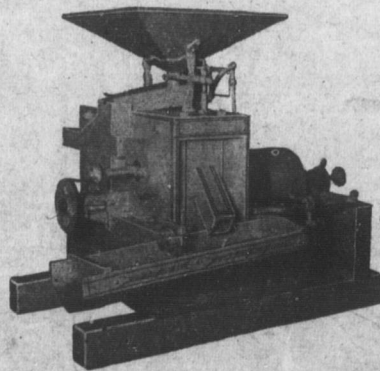

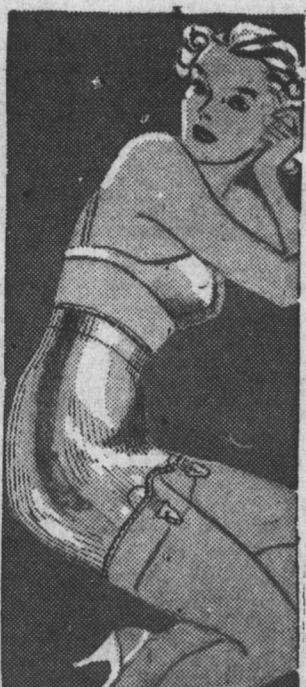
