Mrs. C. J. Holcomb was able to return to her mother's, Mrs. Miles Sprouse, Boonville, from Davis hospital last Wednesday.

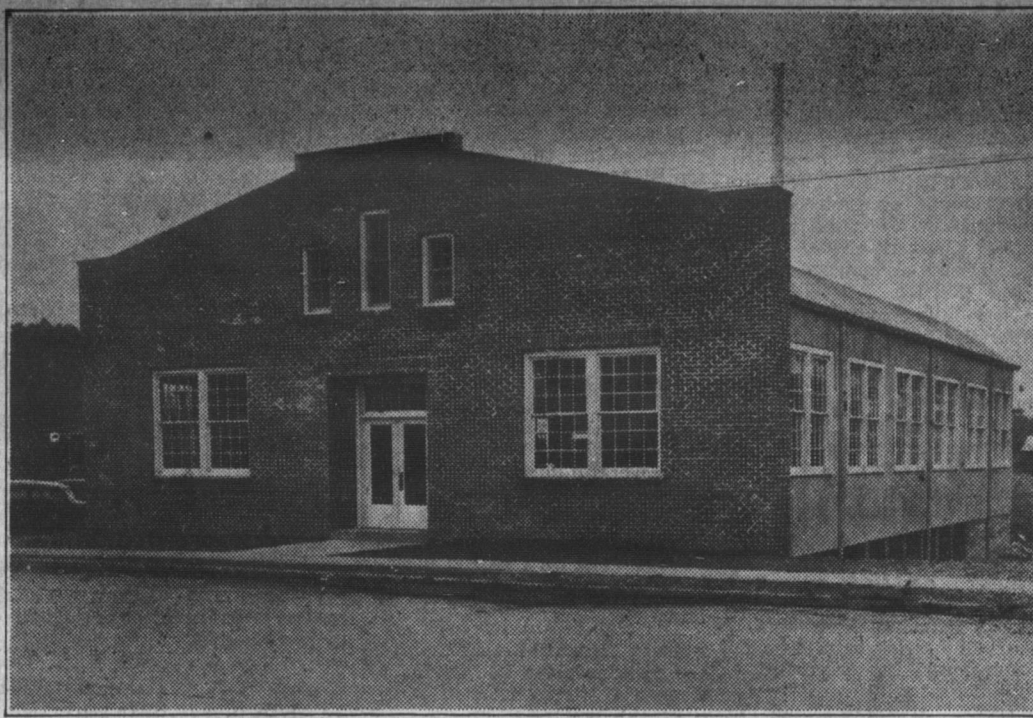
Rose Marlowe Circle Meets With Mrs. Mayberry

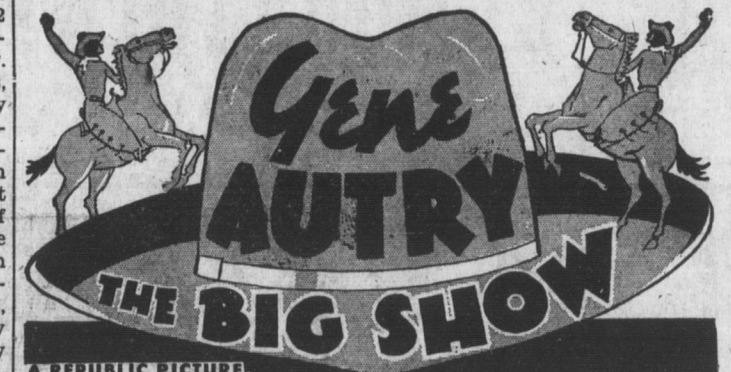
