WAYNICK RESIGNS STATE POSITION

Raleigh, Nov. 26—Capus M. Waynick resigned today as director of the state division of purchase and contract, and immediately Capitol Hill began speculating on his successor

Prominently mentioned tonight to succeed Waynick was W. Z. Betts, who has been in the division since 1920. Waynick's resignation is effec-

tive December 15. He will return to his home at High Point to become editor of the Enterprise. Governor Clyde R. Hoey told The Journal that he would name Waynick's successor within the "two or three days." He next would make no comment as to who he has in mind for the po-

But most political observers here believed the Governor would appoint Betts who is conceded to be the best qualified man in the department for the job. However, it was pointed out that he has been passed by on three other
