Will Observe Same Hours As **During Past**

On Friday of this week the public library will be moved from West Main street to the new Gilvin Roth Y. M. C. A., according to an announcement Tuesday For the present the library will observe the same hours as in the past. Mrs. W. J. Price will continue to serve as librarian.

The library, which was opened here on September 27, 1937, has enjoyed a splendid growth. The project was sponsored by the Elkin Woman's Club during the time that Mrs. Paul Gwyn served as president of that group and much of the growth of the library is due to her untiring efforts. She has served as library chairman for the Woman's Club since its organization.

The library has had financial support from a WPA grant since its beginning, and this with contributions of books and money from individuals and civic organizations has enabled the library committee to acquire 1,250 volumes, including fiction, non-fiction, and reference books, in addition to many magazines and periodicals.

The library will continue to serve the public as it has in the past, the move being made because of the withdrawal of financial support from the WPA and the fact that the new location will be more suitable for the purpose



After the address diplomas and other awards will be made by school officials.




