


## THE PLANES STILL TAKE OFF FOR TOKYO!

#### Russians Took Reich Capital 185 Years Ago

The last time Russia took
Berlin was 185 years ago.

They took it from Frederick the Great, the French-speaking autocrat who brought the Prussian military tradition into first flower. They did it with ill-trained and poorly led troops but held it only three days.

Three years before the Russians barged in, a flying detachment of 4,000 Austrian cavalry under command of daring General Haddick razed a Berlin suburb and forced the capital, under threat of similiar treatment to pay ransom. Within 12 hours Haddick wheeled his troops and was gone before the Prussians discovered the meager size of his forces.

Gustavious Adolphus, the Swedish soldier of the Cross, was in Berlin in 1631.

Napoleon swept in from the west in 1806 and exacted heavy levies to fill his empire war chest.
