The annual 4-H Pullet Show under the sponsorship of the Elkin Hatchery will get underway at the Livestock Market here today at 2 p. m.

Ninety pullets which were placed with 4-H members in February by the hatchery will be entered. Each year 10 boys and girls receive 100 baby New Hampshire chicks which are raised until six months old, and then nine pullets are sold at auction and the money is used to purchase more chicks for the following year.


