Mrs. McKinney was presented a gift of lipen from the hostess, Mrs. James Freeman received the draw prize.

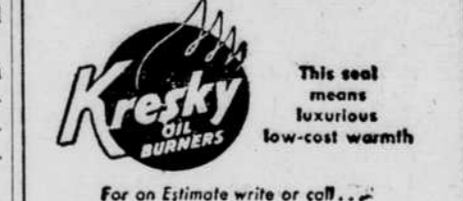
Almonds, pecans, and walnuts are all suitable for poultry stuffing. Add the nuts to the stuffing just before putting it into the fowl.

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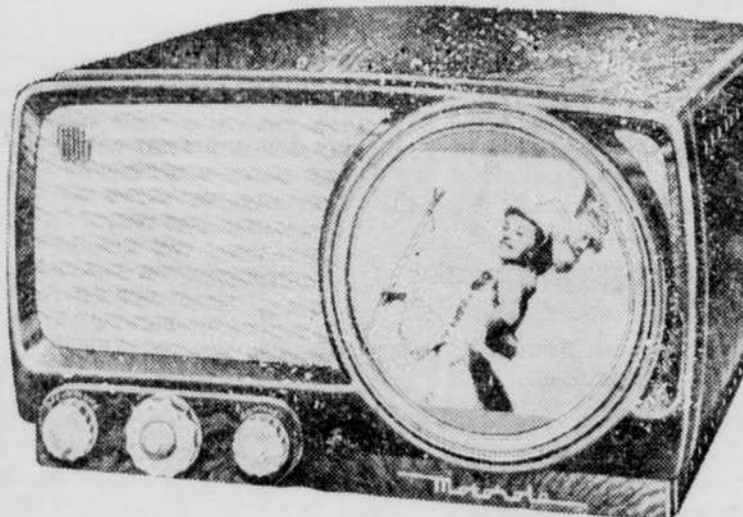


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
