DESPONDENT AND DISAPPOINTED HE TAKES HIS LIFE

J. L. Culberson, of High Point, Commits Suicide in His Home.

WIFE AND CHILDREN FIND HIM LYING DEAD

Had Been Drinking and Had Spoken Before of Taking His Life—Was a Follower of Teachings of Ingersoll—Creates Quite a Stir.

High Point, N. C., Aug. 13.—Sitting on the bed in his room, with his family in hearing, J. L. Culberson this afternoon at five o'clock shot and instantly killed himself, the bullet taking effect in his heart. In a few moments the wife and two little children stood in the presence of death, the little ones tugging at the mother's apron while the parent had screamed hysterically, and four little unweary eyes shifted and seemed to understand it all.

VENEZUELAN IS TRYING TO OUST PRESIDENT CASTRO

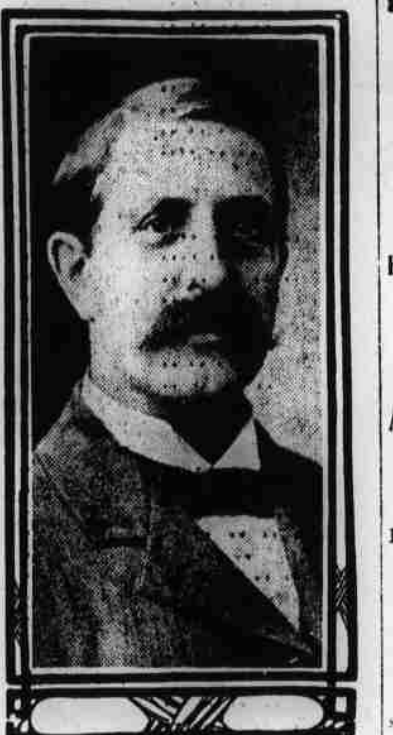
BRYAN RECEIVES MANY INVITATIONS FROM ADMIRERS

KILLS DAUGHTER AND SON, THEN ATTEMPTS SUICIDE

H. J. Dufty, of Los Angeles, Crazed by Fanaticism From a Revival.

ALSO ATTEMPTED TO KILL DIVORCED WIFE

Horrible Crimes Committed by Crazed Father—Had Bought Cemetery Lot and Purchased Coffin for Himself—Used Axe for the Work.

Los Angeles, Cal., Aug. 13.—Driven insane by religious mania, H. J. Dufty, sixty years old, today attacked and killed his son and daughter with an axe and then cut his own throat with a razor, inflicting fatal injuries. The tragedy occurred in the extreme northwestern part of the city. Dufty lived at the home of his son, Fred Dufty. He had been on the verge of violent insanity, it is said, for weeks as a result of religious enthusiasm.
