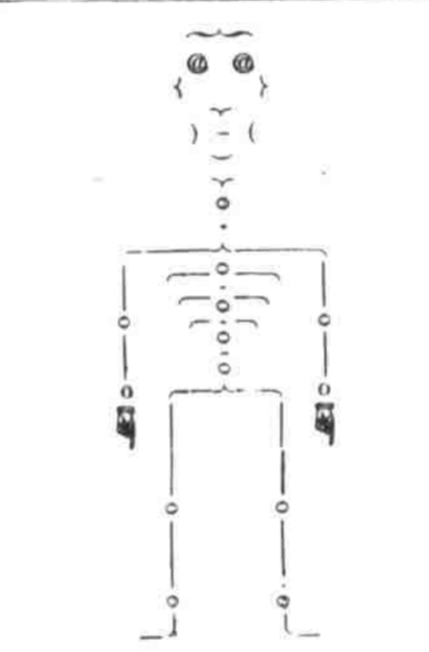
THE WAY OF THE WORLD.
