Mrs. Miller, wife of Joaquin, the poet, and their daughter, Juanita, have rejoined the poet at Oakland, Cal.

Mrs. Grover Cleveland's inheritance from the real estate of her grandfather at Omaha is said to be one-sixteenth of \$800,000.

A house at Americus, Ga., visited by one of the census enumerators Monday, contained seventeen negroes, all of whom made it their home.

Mr. Peck, the Mayor of Milwaukee, has a picturesque habit of prowling around the city in the small hours of the night to see that everything is all right.

Jacob Fisher, who died lately at Kutztown, Pa., was 100 years old, had voted for fifteen Democratic candidates for President and was never ill in his life. Of course not.

The highest military authorities have determined to build in the neighborhood of St. Petersburg a large factory for the manufacture of smokeless powder. The building is to be finished this summer.

Among the various charity societies of Moscow there is one for the endowment of poor brides. The funds of the society are constantly increased by the gifts or bequests of benevolent persons, but only the interest of the money is used for the designated purpose.

It is cold yet up in the Maine woods. Two Connecticut sportsmen who have returned reported snowdrifts two or three feet deep in sheltered places in the forests, and the temperature so cold that fishing in the lakes has been backward.

The ability of the electric system of street car propulsion to handle enormous loads was demonstrated in many places during Decoration week. In Buffalo, on the following Sunday, the four electric cars of the street railway company carried over 15,000 passengers.

R. P. Armstrong, who died the other day of heart disease in the town of Butler, Pa., was the principal owner of the largest oil well ever struck in the United States. It was known as the "Armstrong Well," and was located on Thorn creek, in Butler County, Pa.

An English member of Parliament has patented an invention in which electricity is made use of for improving the extraction of gold. An electrical journal expresses a most feeling regret that some radical means is not available for the extraction from the pockets of subscribers of the gold which has been so long overdue.

The regular running of trains between Baku and Tiflis on the Trans-Caucasian Line was stopped for over an hour on May 13 because immense masses of locusts covered the tracks. A large gang of laborers was required to clear the way. Now there is a sweeping-machine attached to each train.

A census enumerator in Florida got into a quarrel with a neighbor whose house he was visiting for census statistics and stabbed him to death with a knife. He must have felt very badly afterward when he reflected that he not only had committed a crime, but had also lost three cent.

A trap has been invented for gathering to the spirited, reckless moth, and the invention promises to do away with camphor chests and all the other schemes to obliterate the wool chews. The trap is on the principle of a flytrap, lit up by phosphorescence at night and baited with sweet odors and colored glass, supposed to draw the insect.

A process for marbleizing silk plush without pressing or embossing it has been discovered by the Astoria Silk Company. By this process the light and dark effects are reversed when looked at from opposite points. The finish is nicely preserved and does not give the appearance of having been wet, as shown in many goods of this character.

Malcolm L. Ford, who has been treated so much persecution lately from the people who were bound to have him declared a professional, is the son of one of Brooklyn's most eccentric millionaires. There is good reason to believe that the elder Ford disinherited Malcolm when he devoted himself to physical culture, and the poor fellow has had a hard row to hoe several times since.

An Englishman who has been traveling in the West says that the word "Mississippi" always affects him to laughter, because it looks so droll with its f's and s's and p's tread on each other's heels. Maybe it does look a little funny, but it isn't half as ridiculous as "Bogely-cumswank" and similar names common in England.—New York Tribune.
