Viewing the entire range of trade and industry throughout the country, however, the situation shows less improvement than had been expected. The effects of the short grain crops of last year are mani-fest in the smaller movement at interior centres, in the decreased Eastern tonnage of the trunk lines, the decline in cereal exports, and a moderate shrinkage in general business at many points in the West. 
