

NEWS AND COMMENT.

Numerous Events and Happenings Clipped From Various Sources.

INDIANAPOLIS, February 23.—To-day there is a lockout at all the planing mills in this city. All the benches and machine hands demand an eight-hour day and twenty five per cent. advance in wages. The bosses decline to grant either demand.

WILKESBARE, February 23.—Michael Clare, a young married man, employed at the Conyngham shaft, met a horrible death this evening. He slipped and fell down the shaft, which is five hundred feet deep. When picked up he was a mass of broken bones and bruised flesh.

NEW YORK, February 23.—This afternoon the Twenty-eighth street wall of the Fifth Avenue Theatre fell with a crash and broke the water mains running through Twenty-eighth street. That thoroughfare was flooded as far as Sixth avenue and east of Broadway. Nodody was injured.

HARRISBURG, February 23.—An accident occurred to Dr. M. U. Gerhard, physician at the State Lunatic Hospital here, and brother of Superintendent Gerhard, of that institution, which may result in his death. He was driving on Third street this morning, when his carriage collided with a heavy wagon, throwing him out on his head and fracturing his skull.

MAHANOY CITY, February 23.—Joshua Harker, a man employed at the Indian Ridge Shaft, was perhaps fatally injured by a fifty-foot fall at that place to-day. While engaged at his work near the top a board fell on his head, knocking him off the platform. He fell into the pit fifty feet below the surface, where he was found a few minutes later by a searching party.

READING, February 23.—At 7 o'clock this morning a fire broke out in Joseph Klahr's handle factory at Berneville, and despite the efforts of citizens and the firemen the factory and contents were destroyed. The factory was erected ten years ago and new machinery introduced recently. How the fire started is a mystery. Loss on building and contents \$2,000; partly covered by insurance in local companies.

PETERSBURG, Va., February 23.—The negro Scott Bishop, who a few days ago assaulted and robbed Hugh Hammack near Blackstone, a station of the Norfolk and Western Railroad, was lynched this morning. Hammack died on Friday and Bishop was arrested Saturday night at Ridgeway, N. C., and brought to Blackstone yesterday morning. Every effort was made by the authorities to prevent violence being done, but to no avail, and this morning about 4 o'clock he was taken from the officers and hanged to the limb of a tree about half a mile from Blackstone.

UNIONTOWNS, February 23.—The striking coke-workers are annoyed that the 1,000 workmen at W. J. Rainey's plants refuse to strike and persist in working steadily. They made a grand effort to bring out these men to-day. A body of 600 strikers marched from Scottdale to the Fort Hill Works to compel the men there to strike. Rainey's men, however, paid no attention to them, but kept at work, and the presence of twenty-five Pinkerton guards, with Winchester rifles, was so terrifying to the mob that they marched off again without attempting any violence.

PITTSBURG, February 23.—The village of Duxon, about a mile above here, was yesterday the scene of a serious row among a company of drunken Poles. They wanted to run things generally, and when Constable Seymour Smith attempted to arrest one of the leaders the others beat him with stones and bricks. He was in danger of his life, and, seeing there was no other way, he drew his revolver and fired into the crowd. The bullet struck Charles Carlos, causing a serious wound. Smith was arrested this morning, and Judge Rice admitted him to bail in the sum of \$10,000.

LANCASTER, February 23.—Ephraim has a murder mystery which caused great excitement in the little village yesterday. Acting upon information received Deputy Coroner Gomerding made search on the farm of Calvin Hertz, south of the town, and dug up the mutilated body of a woman. The arms, legs and head were cut from the trunk and the face so hacked and cut that recognition is impossible. The different parts had been placed in paper bags. The Deputy Coroner informed the District Attorney, who directed him to make a full investigation, which is now in progress.

ALLENTOWNS, February 23.—Mrs. Sarah Weisert, wife of Conrad Weisert, the ex-Councilman of the Second ward, died yesterday afternoon under peculiar circumstances. Two or three weeks ago Mrs. Weisert accidentally swallowed a piece of glass, which indirectly caused her death. In opening a jar of canned grapes a piece of the top, about an inch long and one-sixteenth of an inch wide, broke off at the top and was lost in the fruit and later formed a part of a pie which Mrs. Weisert baked. Later she ate a piece of the pie and swallowed the glass, which lodged in her throat. A doctor was called in and succeeded in dislodging the glass, which, however, left a sore spot in her throat. A pus excoriated and produced blood poisoning, from which Mrs. Weisert died.
