

Mr. A. K. Smith Elected Enrolling Clerk of the Legislature.

A joint caucus of the Democratic members of the Senate and House was held last evening in the Hall of the House to select a candidate for Enrolling Clerk of the General Assembly.

Mr. W. G. Burkhead, Chief Clerk of the Senate, called the caucus to order and Mr. James H. Poy was chosen Temporary Chairman. The roll was called and the respective secretaries of the Senate and House were requested to act as Secretaries of the caucus. A motion of Hon. W. H. Kitchin prevailed that all not good Democrats be requested to retire.

Mr. W. H. Day, of Halifax, nominated for Enrolling Clerk of the Legislature Mr. A. K. Smith, of Johnston. Mr. A. D. Ward, of Duplin, nominated Mr. Julian A. Turner, of Guilford. After several speeches in favor of both candidates the ballot resulted Smith 71 Turner 53. Mr. Smith was accordingly declared the nominee of the caucus. Mr. Smith served well as Enrolling Clerk at the last term and is well equipped to discharge the duties of the office. — Raleigh News-Observer

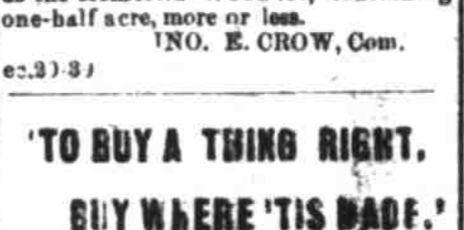
