ANNUAL RATES UNDER CONTRACT WITH CITY OF GOLDSBORO.

SEC. XIII. It is hereby further ordained that the said Henry Hungerford, his associates, successors or assigns may charge and collect the following rates for water furnished by them, payable in quarterly instalments in advance, the connection between the mains and the consumers shall be made at the consumer's expense, and the lowest annual rates to one customer in any case shall not be less than \$5 and no water shall be taken from fire hydrants or drinking fountains for private consumption.
