THE BIG CANAL QUESTION.

The jingo very often does not stop to reason. He usually has a contempt for obligations and conditions. When he sees what he wants he rushes for it with a whoop.

The jingoes are now losing the full flood of their wrath upon the Hay-Pauncefote treaty which guarantees the neutrality of the proposed Nicaragua canal and forbids its fortification.

Mr. Hepburn in his bill for the construction of the canal provides that it shall be under the absolute control of the United States and if it is to be so, of course the United States would have the right to fortify it.

But we are bound by the Clayton Bulwer treaty not to claim exclusive control of the trans-isthmian canal. Even if England should consent to the amendment of the treaty in this respect or to its entire abrogation it would not settle the matter.

The London Spectator calls attention to the difficulties that would still be in the way when it says that those who consider the Clayton Bulwer treaty the only obstacle to a fortified ocean canal act upon the theory that the United States and Great Britain are the only powers on earth.

The Indianapolis News puts the matter in the true light when it says: "All that Great Britain can do is to renounce all claim of sovereignty. She has not the shadow of authority to confer any power on this country to fortify the canal. The most that she can do is to say that she would not object to our doing so. The question is a world question. It should be dealt with as such. The canal ought to be a great international highway, dedicated forever to peaceful use."

It seems certain that the House will accept no canal bill which does not embody absolute control by our government and that the Senate will agree to none that does not guarantee the neutrality of the canal. There is not the slightest prospect that the Senate and the House as they are now constituted will ever agree upon a trans-isthmian canal bill.
