## UNSTABLE AS WATER

As blunders are sometimes worse than crimes, so a weak president may work more mischief than a vicious one.

Nobody has ever accused William McKinley of being vicious, but that he is woefully weak of will has been abundantly demonstrated.

He entered upon the Presidency with words of solemn condemnation of territorial aggression and little more than a year had passed before he was urging the acquisition of territory by conquest.

Last December he declared that our plain duty was to admit Porto Rico to the full benefits of free trade with the United States. Hardly a month had passed before with equal earnestness he advocated the imposition of both import and export duties upon the people of our new possession.

There is scarcely one of the distinctive features of the administration at present which President McKinley has not condemned and denounced. How can the people trust such a man? How can they respect him as an executive, however much they may admire his gentle and affable nature as a man?

Matters are getting worse and worse with the president. The developments of the Cuban postal scandal show that in making some of the most important appointments for that island he either did not inquire into the character and qualifications of the men whom he entrusted with great responsibilities or disregarded convincing evidence of their unfitness. These appointments, like many others in the civil and military service since McKinley became president were practically dictated by powers behind the executive chair. Never before has "pull" been so potent at the white house. Never has the country had a president with so little of that quality which we call backbone. "Pity 'tis, 'tis true!" To the president we may apply, in sorrow, not in anger,
